Warm Bites from South Korea Winter Season



As winter settles over Korea, the streets fill with the irresistible aroma of seasonal treats that warm both body and soul.

Among the most beloved is bungeoppang, a fish-shaped pastry with a crisp shell and sweet red bean filling, while eomuk, skewered fish cakes simmering in broth, offers comfort not only in its chewy texture but especially in the steaming soup that accompanies it. Vendors also roast gun-goguma, sweet potatoes with charred skins and golden, caramel-like centers, and fry hotteok, chewy pancakes bursting with melted brown sugar, cinnamon, and nuts.

Adding to the lineup is gyeran-ppang, or egg bread, a small, fluffy loaf baked with a whole egg inside, creating a perfect balance of savory and sweet. Together, these street snacks capture the essence of Korean winter—simple, hearty, and best enjoyed with cold hands wrapped around something warm.


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Learn, Dance, and Film: K-pop Short Form Class
